- 1791 The first performance of Mozart's opera *The Magic Flute* takes place two months before his death.
- 1791 France's National Constituent Assembly is dissolved, to be replaced the next day by the National Legislative Assembly.
- 1882 Thomas Edison's first commercial hydroelectric power plant (later known as Appleton Edison Light Company) begins operation.
- 1888 Jack the Ripper kills his third and fourth victims, Elizabeth Stride and Catherine Eddowes.
- 1906 The Royal Galician Academy, the Galician language's biggest linguistic authority, starts working in La Coruña, Spain.
- 1907 The McKinley National Memorial, the final resting place of assassinated U.S. President William McKinley and his family, is dedicated in Canton, Ohio.
- 1909 The Cunard Line's RMS *Mauretania* makes a record-breaking westbound crossing of the Atlantic, that will not be bettered for 20 years.
- 1935 The Hoover Dam, astride the border between the U.S. states of Arizona and Nevada, is dedicated.
- 1938 The League of Nations unanimously outlaws "intentional bombings of civilian populations".
- 1939 NBC broadcasts the first televised American football game.
- 1943 The United States Merchant Marine Academy is dedicated by President Roosevelt.

- 1944 The Germans commence a counteroffensive to retake the Nijmegen salient, this having been captured by the allies during Operation Market Garden.
- 1945 The Bourne End rail crash, in Hertfordshire, England, kills 43.
- 1947 The 1947 World Series begins. It is the first to be televised, to include an African-American
 player, to exceed \$2 million in receipts, to see a pinch-hit home run, and to have six umpires on the
 field.
- 1947 Pakistan joins the United Nations.
- 1949 The Berlin Airlift ends.
- 1954 The U.S. Navy submarine USS *Nautilus* is commissioned as the world's first nuclear-powered vessel.
- 1962 James Meredith enters the University of Mississippi, defying racial segregation rules.
- 1966 Bechuanaland declares its independence, and becomes the Republic of Botswana.
- 1968 The Boeing 747 is rolled out and shown to the public for the first time.



- 1980 Ethernet specifications are published by Xerox working with Intel and Digital Equipment Corporation.
- 1993 The 6.2 M_wâ[□]Latur earthquake shakes Maharashtra, India with a maximum Mercalli intensity of VIII (Severe) killing 9,748 and injuring 30,000.
- 1999 The Tokaimura nuclear accident causes the deaths of two technicians in Japan's second-worst nuclear accident.
- 2005 Controversial drawings of Muhammad are printed in a Danish newspaper.

National Events-

- The IAF issued an advisory on Wednesday asking citizens to refrain from throwing eatables in the open as it attracts birds thereby posing a grave threat to aircraft.
- First, of its kind Army Museum and a state-of-art war memorial are being set up in Mumbai to commemorate the glorious achievements of the Indian Army and to showcase the experiences of its bravery, prowess, and restraint.

International Events-

- Turkey and Uzbekistan resume flight to Kabul, Afghanistan
- Dozens of Israeli settlers attacked a Palestinian village in the occupied West Bank, hurling stones at cars and homes and leaving several people wounded, including a Palestinian toddler, activists said on Wednesday
- Republican senators blocked a Bill to keep the Government operating and allow federal borrowing, but Democrats aiming to avert a shutdown pledged to try again — at the same time pressing ahead on President Joe Biden's big plans to reshape Government.
- Youth climate activists Vanessa Nakate and Greta Thunberg chastised global leaders on Tuesday for failing to meet funding pledges and for delivering too much "blah blah" as climate change wreaks havoc around the world.
- The White House has tried to pacify an upset American media over Joe Biden's off-the-cuff remarks that the Indian press is "better behaved" than their US counterparts, with a senior official saying the President's comments were not meant as a "hard cut" on them.

Technology-

- Google has started to roll out an animated video background feature for Google Meet users on Android.
- YouTube will block all anti-vaccine content, moving beyond its ban on false information about the COVID vaccines to include content that contains misinformation
- The latest update to the app adds a new feature called "emergency SOS" that lets Pixel users tap the power button 5 times to quickly call emergency services
- Aadhaar custodian UIDAI has slashed the price for authentication by customers to Rs 3 from Rs 20 per instance to enable entities to leverage their infrastructure

Economy -

- The 30-share Sensex was trading 178.60 points or 0.30 percent lower at 59,234.67. Similarly, the Nifty declined 49.15 points or 0.28 percent to 17,662.15.
- India's external debt rose modestly by 2.1 percent year-on-year to USD 570 billion as of March-end 2021, notwithstanding the Covid-19 pandemic, according to the Finance Ministry. The external debt to GDP ratio rose marginally to 21.1 percent from 20.6 percent as of end-March 2020.
- Indian companies' external commercial borrowings surged manifold to over USD 2.84 billion in August 2021, the Reserve Bank data showed on Wednesday. The domestic firms had raised USD 145.74 million from the overseas markets in August 2020.
- Capital markets regulator Sebi on Wednesday decided to introduce a swing pricing mechanism for open-ended debt mutual fund schemes, a move that will discourage large investors from sudden redemptions.



• The financial institutions in the G20 economies have nearly USD 22 trillion of exposure to carbon-intensive sectors, of which 60 percent are with banks, 30 percent with asset managers equity holdings, and the rest are weighted towards cash and Government securities, according to a report.
