# Today's Event – 30<sup>th</sup> October 2021

- 758 Guangzhou is sacked by Arab and Persian pirates.
- 1137 Ranulf of Apulia defeats Roger II of Sicily at the Battle of Rignano, securing his position as duke until his death two years later.
- 1270 The Eighth Crusade ends by an agreement between Charles I of Anjou (replacing his deceased brother King Louis IX of France) and the Hafsid dynasty of Tunis, Tunisia.
- 1817 Simón Bolívar becomes President of the Third Republic of Venezuela.
- 1831 Nat Turner is arrested for leading the bloodiest slave rebellion in United States history.
- 1863 Danish Prince Vilhelm arrives in Athens to assume his throne as George I, King of the Hellenes.
- 1864 The Treaty of Vienna is signed, by which Denmark relinquishes one province each to Prussia and Austria.
- 1888 The Rudd Concession is granted by Matabeleland to agents of Cecil Rhodes.
- 1905 Czar Nicholas II issues the October Manifesto, granting the Russian peoples basic civil liberties and the right to form a duma. (October 17 in the Julian calendar)
- 1920 The Communist Party of Australia is founded in Sydney.
- 1938 Orson Welles broadcasts a radio adaptation of H. G. Wells's *The War of the Worlds*, causing a massive panic in some of the audience in the United States.
- 1941 President Roosevelt approves \$1 billion in Lend-Lease aid to the Allied nations.
- 1945 Jackie Robinson of the Kansas City Monarchs signs a contract for the Brooklyn Dodgers, breaking the baseball colour line.
- 1947 The General Agreement on Tariffs and Trade (GATT), the foundation of the World Trade Organization (WTO), is founded.
- 1948 A *luzzu* fishing boat overloaded with passengers capsizes and sinks in the Gozo Channel off Qala, Gozo, Malta, killing 23 of the 27 people on board. [1]
- 1953 President Eisenhower approves the top-secret document NSC 162/2 concerning the maintenance of a strong nuclear deterrent force against the Soviet Union.
- 1961 The Soviet Union detonates the Tsar Bomba, the most powerful explosive device ever detonated.
- 1961 Due to "violations of Vladimir Lenin's precepts", it is decreed that Joseph Stalin's body be removed from its place of honour inside Lenin's tomb and buried near the Kremlin Wall with a plain granite marker.
- 1973 The Bosphorus Bridge in Turkey is completed, connecting the continents of Europe and Asia over the Bosphorus for the second time.



- 1975 Prince Juan Carlos I of Spain becomes acting head of state, taking over for the country's ailing dictator, Gen. Francisco Franco.
- 1980 El Salvador and Honduras agree to put the border dispute fought over in 1969's Football War before the International Court of Justice.
- 1983 The first democratic elections in Argentina, after seven years of military rule, are held.
- 1985 Space Shuttle *Challenger* lifts off for mission STS-61-A, its final successful mission.
- 1995 Quebec citizens narrowly vote (50.58% to 49.42%) in favour of remaining a province of Canada in their second referendum on national sovereignty.
- 2005 The rebuilt Dresden Frauenkirche (destroyed in the firebombing of Dresden during World War II) is reconsecrated after a thirteen-year rebuilding project.
- 2014 Sweden is the first European Union member state to officially recognize the State of Palestine.

### **National Events-**

- Bengal Chief Minister on Friday arrived in Goa with a new message of camaraderie telling she too was Goa's daughter and "your sister" who had come to take part in the development of the tiny State.
- Attacking both the TRS and the BJP for the "brazen violation of the model code of conduct (MCC)", the Congress on Thursday alleged that both the parties tried to influence voters by distributing money and gifts, obstructing the conduct of a free and fair election.
- With the Government opening the doors of the elite National Defence Academy (NDA) for women cadets, Army Chief General M M Naravane said on Friday it is expected they are welcomed with the same sense of fair play and professionalism as Indian armed forces are known world over.
- In a significant development towards self-reliance in niche technology, the DRDO and IAF team jointly on Friday flight tested indigenously developed Long-Range Bomb successfully from an aerial platform. The bomb can hit a target between a range of 50 kms and 150kms.
- Pneumococcal Conjugate Vaccine (PCV), which protects young children from pneumonia, meningitis
  and blood infections caused by Streptococcus pneumoniae bacteria, has been brought under the ambit
  of the Universal Immunisation Programme (UIP).

### **International Events-**

- For years, Zebulon Simentov branded himself as the "last Jew of Afghanistan," the sole remnant of a centuries-old community. He charged reporters for interviews and held court in Kabul's only remaining synagogue. He left the country last month for Istanbul after the Taliban seized power.
- Prime Minister Narendra Modi was on Friday greeted by a jubilant and cheering Indian diaspora, who recited hymns and chanted his name to welcome him on his visit to Italy.
- South Korea will launch a project next month to develop a homegrown naval interception system
  designed to protect warships from hostile aircraft and missiles, the state arms procurement agency
  said Friday.
- The US Secretary of State Tony Blinken announced on Thursday that the United States will roll out USD144 million in a bid to help the people of Afghanistan who have been facing a grave humanitarian crisis since the atrocious Taliban takeover.



 An unprecedented meeting of Inter-Parliamentary Alliance on China (IPAC) is taking place in Rome to coincide with the G20 summit to expose China's human rights abuses before the international community.

- Defending champions West Indies kept alive their slender hopes of making the semifinals while virtually knocking Bangladesh out of the T20 World Cup with a narrow three-run win here on Friday.
- Skipper Babar Azam hit a composed 51 while Asif Ali hit four sixes in the penultimate over as Pakistan completed a hat-trick of victories in the T20 World Cup with a five-wicket win over Afghanistan in a Super 12 Group 2 match, here on Friday.
- New Zealand pacer Adam Milne, who was drafted into the squad in place of injured Lockie Ferguson, is eager to make the most of his rich vein of form in the ongoing T20 World Cup, including in the Super 12 match against India here on Sunday.
- Australia opener David Warner has highlighted the importance of having a "stable base" while batting
  on the slow wickets of the UAE after roaring back to form with a belligerent half-century.
- Star Australian opener David Warner did a Cristiano Ronaldo during the ongoing T20 World Cup here as he removed Coca Cola bottles placed in front of him during a press conference for a brief while.

#### Technology-

• Jio phone Next will be available from Diwali for Rs 6,499 per unit for customers wanting to buy the smartphone without financing option, Jio and Google said in a joint statement on Friday.

#### Economy -

- Lubes maker Castrol India has reported 9 per cent dip in profit after tax (PAT) at Rs 185.9 crore for the third quarter ended September 2021. The company had reported a net profit of Rs 204.6 crore in the July-September quarter of previous fiscal
- The country's foreign exchange reserves declined by USD 908 million to USD 640.1 billion in the week ended October 22, RBI data showed. In the previous week ended October 15, the reserves had increased by USD 1.492 billion to USD 641.008 billion.
- India is expected to have the highest ever horticulture production of 331.05 million tonnes in 2020-21, as compared to 320.47 million tonnes over previous year.
- The eight infrastructure sectors of coal, crude oil, natural gas, refinery products, fertilisers, steel, cement and electricity had grown by 0.6 per cent in September 2020, as per the data released by the commerce and industry ministry.



• The Union Government's fiscal deficit has worked out to be Rs 5.26 lakh crore or 35 per cent of the budget estimates at the end of September 2021, as per the data released by the Controller General of Accounts (CGA) on Friday
