Today's Event – 16th November 2021

- 1797 The Prussian heir apparent, Frederick William, becomes King of Prussia as Frederick William III.
- 1805 Napoleonic Wars: Battle of Schöngrabern: Russian forces under Pyotr Bagration delay the pursuit by French troops under Joachim Murat.
- 1822 American Old West: Missouri trader William Becknell arrives in Santa Fe, New Mexico, over a route that became known as the Santa Fe Trail.
- 1828 Greek War of Independence: The London Protocol entails the creation of an autonomous Greek state under Ottoman suzerainty, encompassing the Morea and the Cyclades.
- 1849 A Russian court sentences writer Fyodor Dostoyevsky to death for anti-government activities linked to a radical intellectual group; his sentence is later commuted to hard labor.
- 1855 David Livingstone becomes the first European to see the Victoria Falls in what is now Zambia-Zimbabwe.
- 1857 Second relief of Lucknow: Twenty-four Victoria Crosses are awarded, the most in a single day.
- 1863 American Civil War: In the Battle of Campbell's Station, Confederate troops unsuccessfully attack Union forces which allows General Ambrose Burnside to secure Knoxville, Tennessee.
- 1871 The National Rifle Association receives its charter from New York State.
- 1885 Canadian rebel leader of the Métis and "Father of Manitoba" Louis Riel is executed for treason.
- 1904 English engineer John Ambrose Fleming receives a patent for the thermionic valve (vacuum tube).
- 1907 Indian Territory and Oklahoma Territory join to form Oklahoma, which is admitted as the 46th U.S. state.
- 1914 The Federal Reserve Bank of the United States officially opens.
- 1920 Qantas, Australia's national airline, is founded as Queensland and Northern Territory Aerial Services Limited.
- 1933 The United States and the Soviet Union establish formal diplomatic relations.
- 1938 LSD is first synthesized by Albert Hofmann from ergotamine at the Sandoz Laboratories in Basel.
- 1945 UNESCO is founded
- 1965 Venera program: The Soviet Union launches the *Venera 3* space probe toward Venus, which will be the first spacecraft to reach the surface of another planet.
- 1973 Skylab program: NASA launches *Skylab 4* with a crew of three astronauts from Cape Canaveral, Florida for an 84-day mission.
- 1973 U.S. President Richard Nixon signs the Trans-Alaska Pipeline Authorization Act into law, authorizing the construction of the Alaska Pipeline
- 1974 The Arecibo message is broadcast from Puerto Rico.



- 1979 The first line of Bucharest Metro (Line M1) is opened from Timpuri Noi to SemÄnäntoarea in Bucharest, Romania.
- 1988 The Supreme Soviet of the Estonian Soviet Socialist Republic declares that Estonia is "sovereign" but stops short of declaring independence.
- 1988 In the first open election in more than a decade, voters in Pakistan elect populist candidate Benazir Bhutto to be Prime Minister of Pakistan.
- 1989 El Salvadoran army troops kills six Jesuit priests and two others at Jose Simeon Canas University.
- 1990 Pop group Milli Vanilli are stripped of their Grammy Award because the duo did not sing at all on the *Girl You Know It's True* album. Session musicians had provided all the vocals.
- 1992 The Hoxne Hoard is discovered by metal detectorist Eric Lawes in Hoxne, Suffolk.
- 1997 After nearly 18 years of incarceration, the People's Republic of China releases Wei Jingsheng, a pro-democracy dissident, from jail for medical reasons.
- 2002 The first cases of the 2002–2004 SARS outbreak are traced to Foshan, Guangdong Province, China
- 2005 Following a 31-year wait, Australia defeats Uruguay in a penalty shootout to qualify for the 2006 FIFA World Cup.

National Events-

- "Today we are making such a system in which the thinking of 'Sarkar Sarvam', the interference of the government is also decreasing, and your work is also getting easier. Minimum government, maximum governance," PM Modi asserted.
- The ministry said the daily rise in new coronavirus infections has been below 20,000 for 39 straight days and less than 50,000 daily new cases have been reported for 142 consecutive days now.
- The Mahasabha activists installed the statues of Godse and Apte at 'Balidhan Dham' in Meerut (Uttar Pradesh) on Monday, he said.
- The Yamuna Expressway connects Noida to Agra while the Lucknow-Agra Expressway goes up to the state capital. The Purvanchal Expressway will end about 18 km from the UP-Bihar border.
- Manu Bhandari, on whose stories popular films Rajnigandha (1974) and Swami (1977) were based, passed away on Monday in Gurgaon. She was 90.

International Events-

- Pro-Palestine organisations have called on Lalela Mswane, crowned Miss South Africa in October, and pageant organiser Miss SA to boycott the December event to condemn Israel's treatment of the Palestinian people.
- In rapidly aging Japan, more diapers are used by older, incontinent people than by babies. As the country groans under the weight of ever-rising mountains of this waste, the town of Houki has become a pioneer in trying to reduce it. By recycling the diapers, which represent about one-tenth of the town's trash, it has diverted garbage that would otherwise be dumped in incinerators and add emissions to the atmosphere.



- Artillery shells fired by Russian-backed separatists shrieked into this small town deep in the flatlands of
 eastern Ukraine, shearing branches from trees, scooping out craters, blowing up six houses and killing
 one Ukrainian soldier.
- Jose Martinez, A former Army gunner whose right arm and both legs were blown off by a roadside bomb in Afghanistan, has a new calling: He has become one of the most effective lobbyists in a campaign to legalize the therapeutic use of psychedelic drugs across the country.
- Global wealth tripled over the last two decades, with China leading the way and overtaking the U.S. for the top spot worldwide.

- Australia lifted their maiden T20 World Cup trophy with a commanding eight-wicket win over New Zealand in the title clash which was rendered one-sided by Mitchell Marsh with his blistering 77-run knock, on Sunday.
- The ministry of youth affairs and sports announced the National Sports Awards on 2 November.
 National Sports Awards are given every year to recognize and reward excellence in sports. As many as 12 sportspersons, including Olympics gold medallist Neeraj Chopra and wrestler Ravi Kumar Dahiya, received National Sports Awards 2021 on Saturday.
- Australia's Marcus Stoinis, holding helmet, and Matthew Wade celebrate after winning the Cricket Twenty20 World Cup semi-final match between Pakistan and Australia in Dubai, UAE, Thursday, Nov. 11, 2021.
- England qualifies for 2022 Qatar World Cup

Technology-

- WhatsApp recently rolled out a beta update with the multi-device feature for more users.
- Bitcoin went through a major upgrade that enables its blockchain to execute more complex transactions, potentially widening the virtual currency's use cases
- A new Wi-Fi tech is being developed by the Wi-Fi Alliance



- A group of U.S. states led by Texas have filed an amended complaint against Alphabet Inc's Google accusing the tech giant of using coercive tactics
- According to the complaint filed in Manhattan federal court, Tesla in 2014 sold warrants to JPMorgan that would pay off if their "strike price" were below Tesla's share price

Economy -

- Bitcoin, the largest digital token, was down 4% at about \$61,400 as of 1:32 p.m. in Singapore. Second-ranked Ether slid as much as 6.8%.
- Tarsons Products IPO: The Rs 1,023.84 crore initial public offering (IPO) of Tarsons Products is available from November 15-17, 2021. It has a price band of Rs 635-662 per share.
- The 30-share index was trading 122.35 points or 0.20 per cent lower at 60,596.36 in initial deals. Similarly, the Nifty fell 45.45 points or 0.25 per cent to 18,064.
- Inflation, based on the Wholesale Price Index (WPI), has remained in double digits for the seventh straight month in October. WPI inflation in September was at 10.66 per cent, while in October 2020 it was at 1.31 per cent.
- Finance Minister Nirmala Sitharaman said states would be given Rs 95,082 crore in November, as tax devolution by advancing one instalment, which would have been paid in March, other than the amount due in devolution.

Local -

- On November 4, at Pazhaiyur in Pappanaickenpalayam near Coimbatore, three people died after consuming alcohol. The accused committed the act out of personal enmity.
- Light-to-moderate rain is also likely to occur at many places in the rest of Tamil Nadu.
- The opposition Congress in Karnataka has questioned the BJP government over the alleged bitcoin scam case and its investigation.
- Officials said Sunny Parmar has more than 35 cases registered against him and in majority of the cases, he posed as a police official to blackmail and extort money from businessmen or politicians.
- West Bengal Chief Minister Mamata Banerjee on Sunday said school and higher education and tourism departments of her government have secured gold at the Skoch award.
