Today's Event – 26th October 2021

- 1774 The first Continental Congress adjourns in Philadelphia.
- 1825 The Erie Canal opens, allowing direct passage from the Hudson River to Lake Erie.
- 1860 The Expedition of the Thousand ends when Giuseppe Garibaldi presents his conquests to King Victor Emmanuel of Sardinia.
- 1863 The Football Association is founded.
- 1890 Malleco Viaduct in Chile, at the time "the highest railroad bridge in the world", is inaugurated by President José Manuel Balmaceda.
- 1892 Ida B. Wells publishes Southern Horrors: Lynch Law in All Its Phases.
- 1905 King Oscar II recognizes the dissolution of the union between Norway and Sweden.
- 1936 The first electric generator at Hoover Dam goes into full operation.
- 1947 Kashmir conflict: The Maharaja of Kashmir and Jammu signs the Instrument of Accession with India.
- 1955 After the last Allied troops have left the country, and following the provisions of the Austrian Independence Treaty, Austria declares that it will never join a military alliance.
- 1955 Ngô Ä@ình Diá»@m proclaimed himself Premier of the newly created Republic of Vietnam.
- 1958 Pan American Airways makes the first commercial flight of the Boeing 707 from New York City to Paris.
- 1967 Mohammad Reza Pahlavi crowns himself Emperor of Iran.
- 1968 The Soyuz 3 mission achieves the first Soviet space rendezvous.
- 1977 Ali Maow Maalin, the last natural case of smallpox, develops a rash in Somalia. The World Health Organization and the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention consider this date to be the anniversary of the eradication of smallpox, the most spectacular success of vaccination.
- 1991 Three months after the end of the Ten-Day War, the last soldier of the Yugoslav People's Army leaves the territory of the Republic of Slovenia.
- 1994 Jordan and Israel sign a peace treaty.
- 1995 Mossad agents assassinate Islamic Jihad leader Fathi Shaqaqi in his hotel in Malta.
- 1999 Britain's House of Lords votes to end the right of most hereditary peers to vote in Britain's upper chamber of Parliament.
- 2000 A wave of protests forces Robert Guéï to step down as president after the Ivorian presidential election.
- 2001 The United States passes the USA PATRIOT Act into law.

National Events-



- Defence Minister Rajnath Singh on Monday made a surprise inspection of the offices of his Ministry at the South Block in the Raisina Hills area to check the work environment. He went around various office blocks and inspected cleanliness, work atmosphere and interacted with the employees, officials said.
- The UN weather agency on Monday warned that the world is 'way off the track' on reaching targets to curb rising temperatures as greenhouse gas concentrations had hit a new record high in 2020 and increased at a faster rate than the annual average for the last decade.
- The southwest monsoon withdrew from the entire country on Monday, making it the seventh-most delayed retreat since 1975. According to the India Meteorological Department (IMD), the southwest monsoon retreated on or after October 25 five times between 2010 and 2021.
- Ensuring safe maritime connectivity besides peace and security is a must for development and prosperity of the BIMSTEC region, Foreign Secretary Harsh Shringla said on Monday. He also underlined the need for seamless transportation.
- The Enforcement Directorate (ED) has attached assets worth about Rs 6.85 crore of Jayshree Thakur, the then Additional District Magistrate (ADM), Bhagalpur, and her family members under the provisions of Prevention of Money Laundering Act in a Disproportionate Assets Case.

International Events-

- South Korean President Moon Jae-in and his US counterpart Joe Biden are expected to hold a bilateral
 meeting on the sidelines of a G20 summit in Italy or the UN climate summit in Glasgow a senior official
 said on Monday.
- Florida's top health official was asked to leave a meeting after refusing to wear a mask at the office of a state senator who told him she had a serious medical condition, officials have confirmed.
- The incident happened at the mine about 50 km (30 miles) north of the capital, Harare, police said. While villagers mourned the death of a local but had no sympathy for the Chinese nationals. It was reported that villagers from around SAS Mine in Mazowe expressed joy following the death of six Chinese nationals who were managers at the site. The villagers described the late Chinese managers as 'stubborn' and very dis-respectful who ill-treated locals.
- The current outbreak in China is caused by the delta variant from overseas, Wu Liangyou, an official at
 the National Health Commission, said at a briefing in Beijing Sunday. The wave of infections spread to
 11 provinces in the week from Oct. 17, Mi Feng, spokesman for the commission, said at the briefing.
 Most of the people infected have cross-region travel histories, Mi said. He urged areas that have been
 affected by the pandemic to adopt "emergency mode."
- Former Facebook data scientist turned whistleblower Frances Haugen plans to answer questions
 Monday from lawmakers in the United Kingdom who are working on legislation to rein in the power of social media companies.

Economy -

- The 30-share index was trading 318.7 points or 0.52 per cent higher at 61,285.75 in initial deals. Similarly, the Nifty surged 93.75 points or 0.52 per cent to 18,219.15.
- The economy is likely to register a 9.5 per cent growth this fiscal over 7.3 per cent contraction last year, as the ongoing recovery is faster and more credible than earlier foreseen, according to a foreign brokerage report.
- The Government on Monday signed the share purchase agreement with Tata Sons for the sale of national carrier Air India for Rs 18,000 crore.
